This has, however, left me suffering from a bout of 'mixed emotions' - a certain degree more freedom in the setting out of the magazine, but a steep learning curve when it comes to the computer software needed to produce TODAY in a format usable by commercial printers - Culm Print. It has been an interesting challenge, and whether or not I have succeeded, is for you to judge!

One area where I hope to improve is in eliminating the repetition which has tended to creep in where several parishes may report on the same 'group' events. To that end, it is hoped that each issue will contain a 'general' section, which will include articles, such as the Holiday Club, which are relevant to more than just the one parish. Those who report for each parish should not, however, feel deterred from including such information, since it can always be moved around on the computer if this is felt to be advantageous. Those who wrote about "It's a knockout" will, hopefully, see what I mean.

Your feedback will be helpful - positive or otherwise!

Another issue is that certain parishes are more verbose than others in their contributions! To avoid the print becoming too small, the overall amount of reporting has to be restricted to about 7,500 words (excluding the front page). Allowing for the 'general' section, this leaves an average of 700 words for each parish. It will not only be easier for me if contributors can bear this in mind, but it will be you, and not me, who decides what goes in your reports and what is left out!

COWS AND FOOTPATHS

There has been a lot of publicity about the dangers of walking dogs on footpaths in fields where there are cows and calves. A suckling cow is one that rears its own calf, is not milked like a dairy herd, and often is not handled a lot, so is not used to people. She is less domesticated than her dairy cousin, and has a very strong bond with her calf. This means that when a person comes into a field with a dog, which cows do not like, she may attack. This could lead to a dangerous situation. If you are on the end of a lead, you could end up as collateral damage. Therefore if you see cows with calves in a field with a footpath going through it, you should question if it is essential to take your dog on that route, as it is much safer to avoid. The dog may well be chased by the cows; it will almost certainly outrun them, but tricky if it comes to hide behind your legs. There have been calls for cattle to be banned from fields with footpaths; this is unrealistic. Some farmers feel that no dogs should be on "their" footpaths; that, too, is unrealistic. Commonsense should prevail, to avoid taking dogs among cows and calves, but it is this disconnection from livestock for most of the population that exacerbates the problem.

I think that it is quite pertinent, and I do not like to suggest that farmers should avoid putting such cows on fields with footpaths, or fence the footpaths off with white tape, but it might be worth considering.


Oakford
